Participation of the issue

by stake-holders

- Owner: state, private, church
- Operator: university, university of applied science, college
- Customer – students, industry, society

by profession-

- natural science, social science, art, economic, medical, informatics, engineering science etc.

by time period

- Short term – financial year
- Medium term – 3-4 years
- Long term – strategic initiatives

Means, tools, resources

For war you need three things: money, money, money (Raimondo Montecuccoli 1609-1680).

But the bad news is, that money itself is not enough!

(Even in case when there is enough money...central budget, grants, funds, fees, revenue etc.)

Growing economy, low unemployment rate, strong competition for human resources at an international level – problems with the “supply” of academic staff
