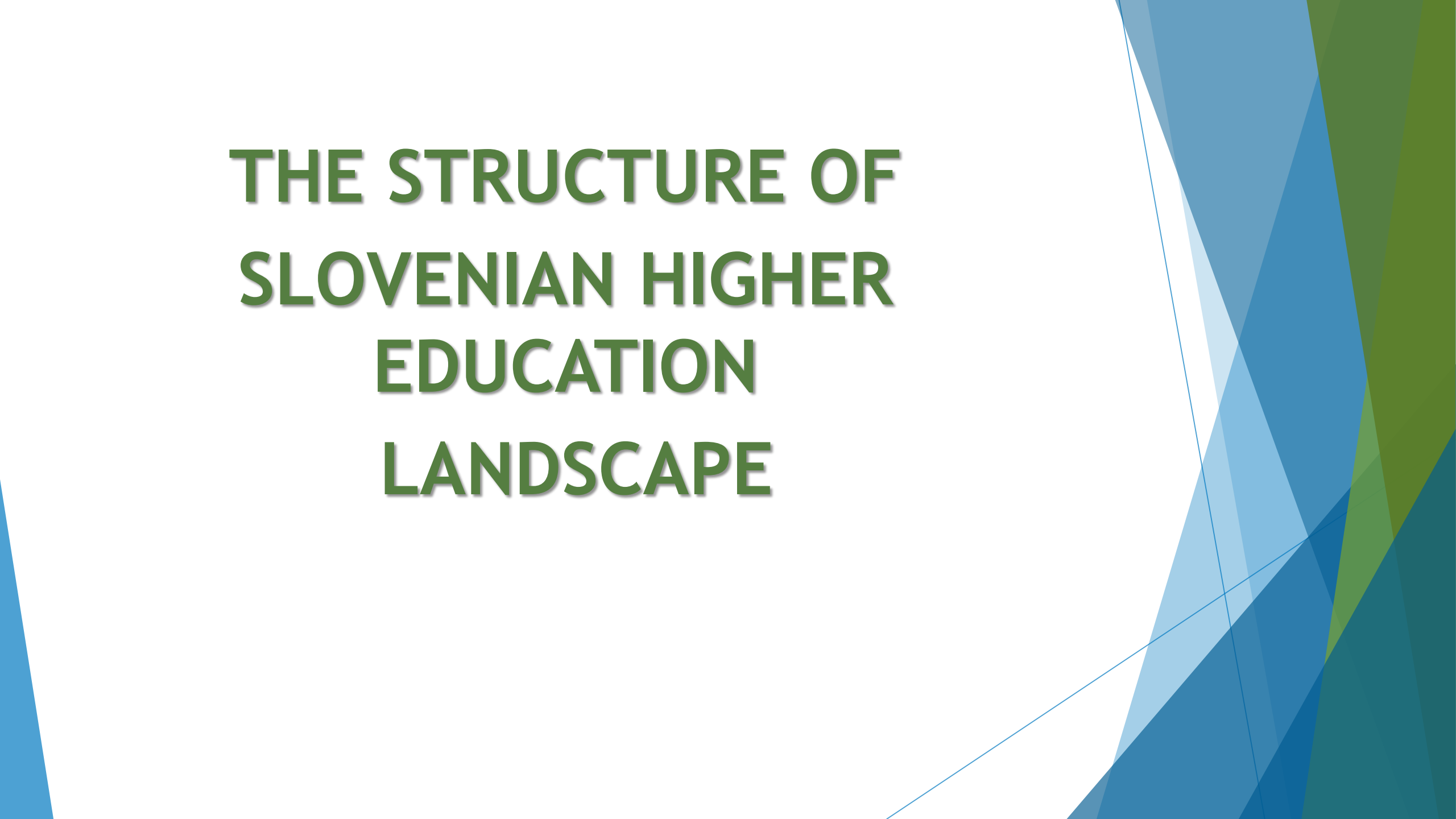
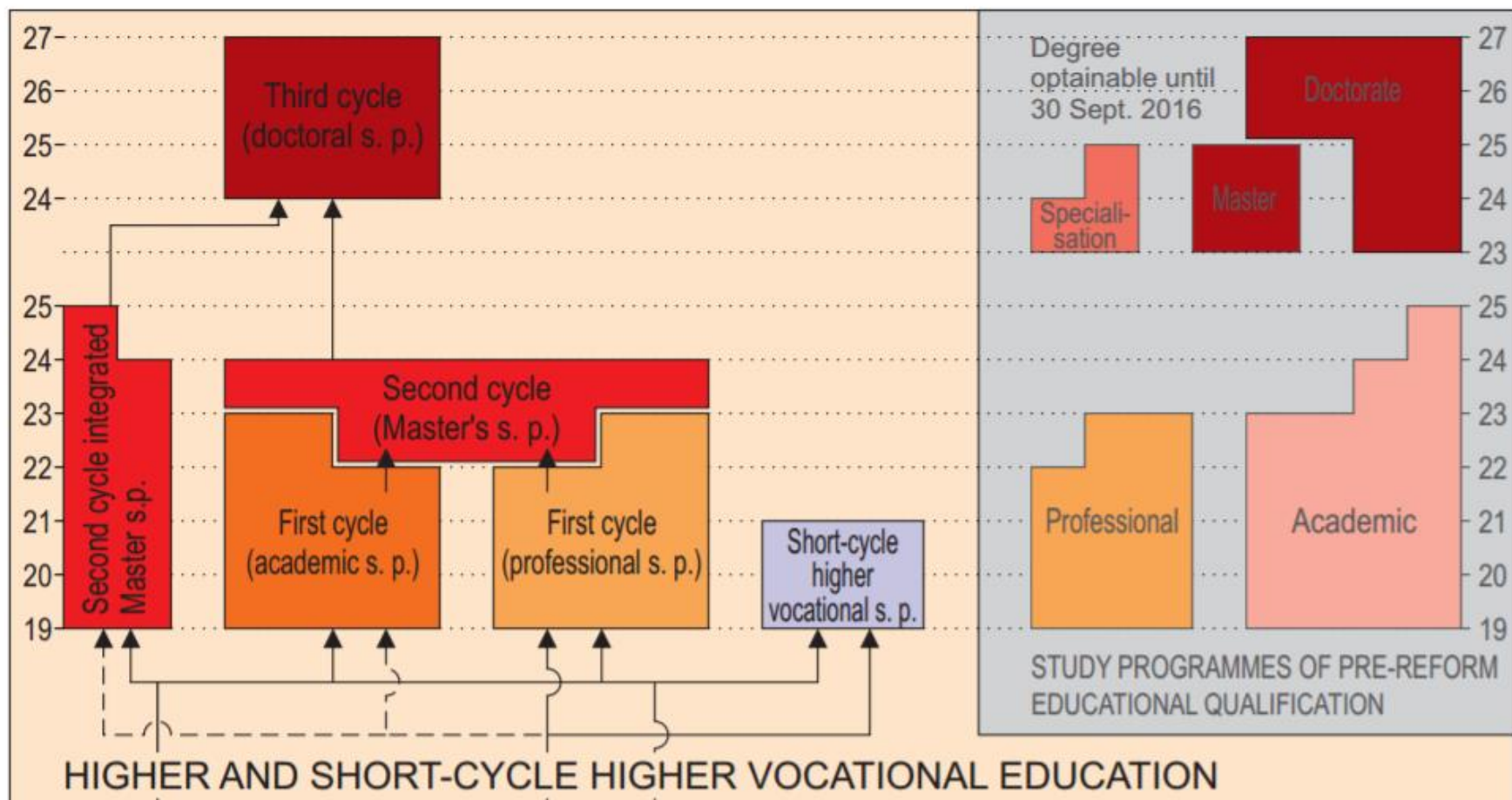

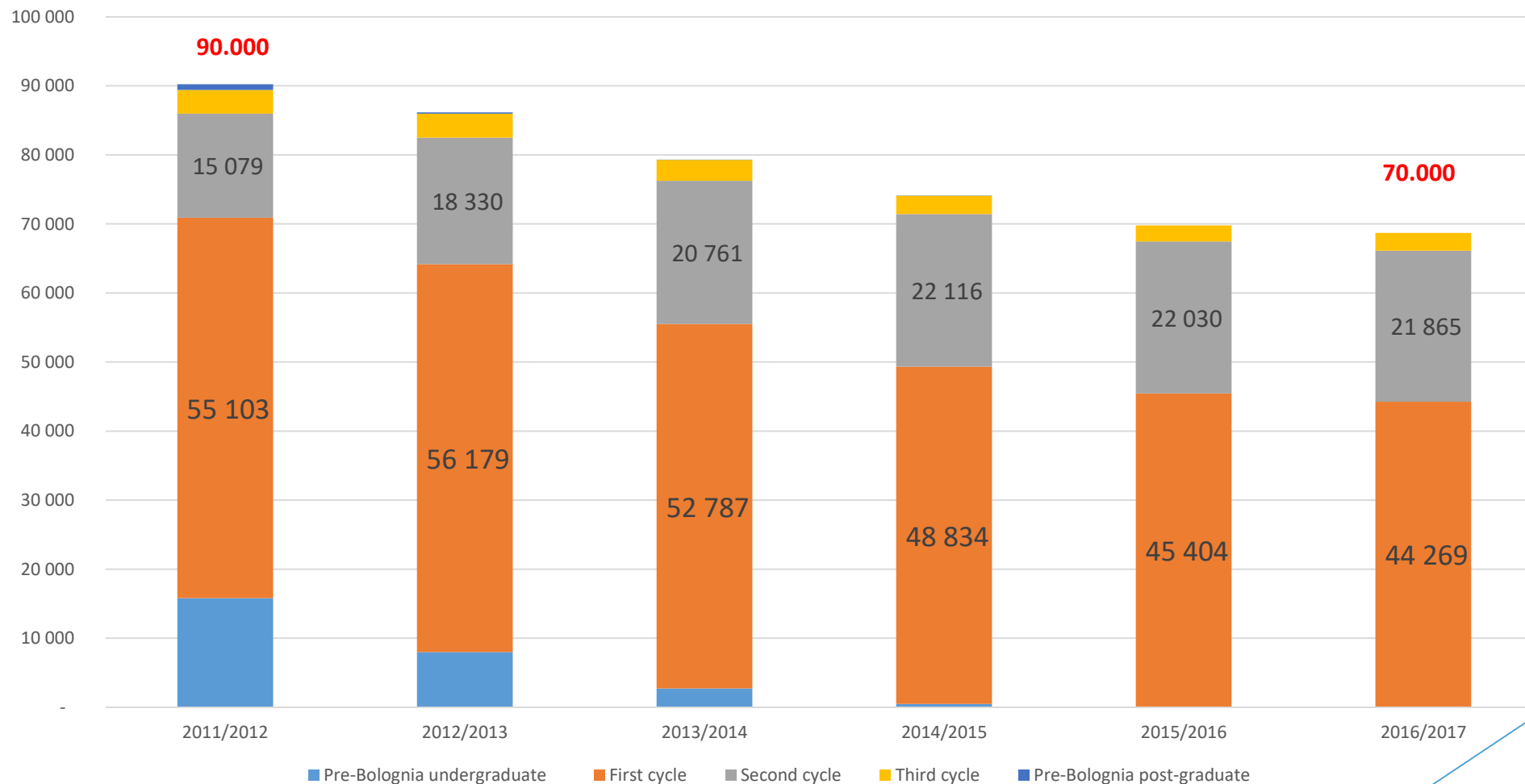


Structure of the HE System in Slovenia

STRUCTURE OF THE EDUCATION SYSTEM IN THE REPUBLIC OF SLOVENIA

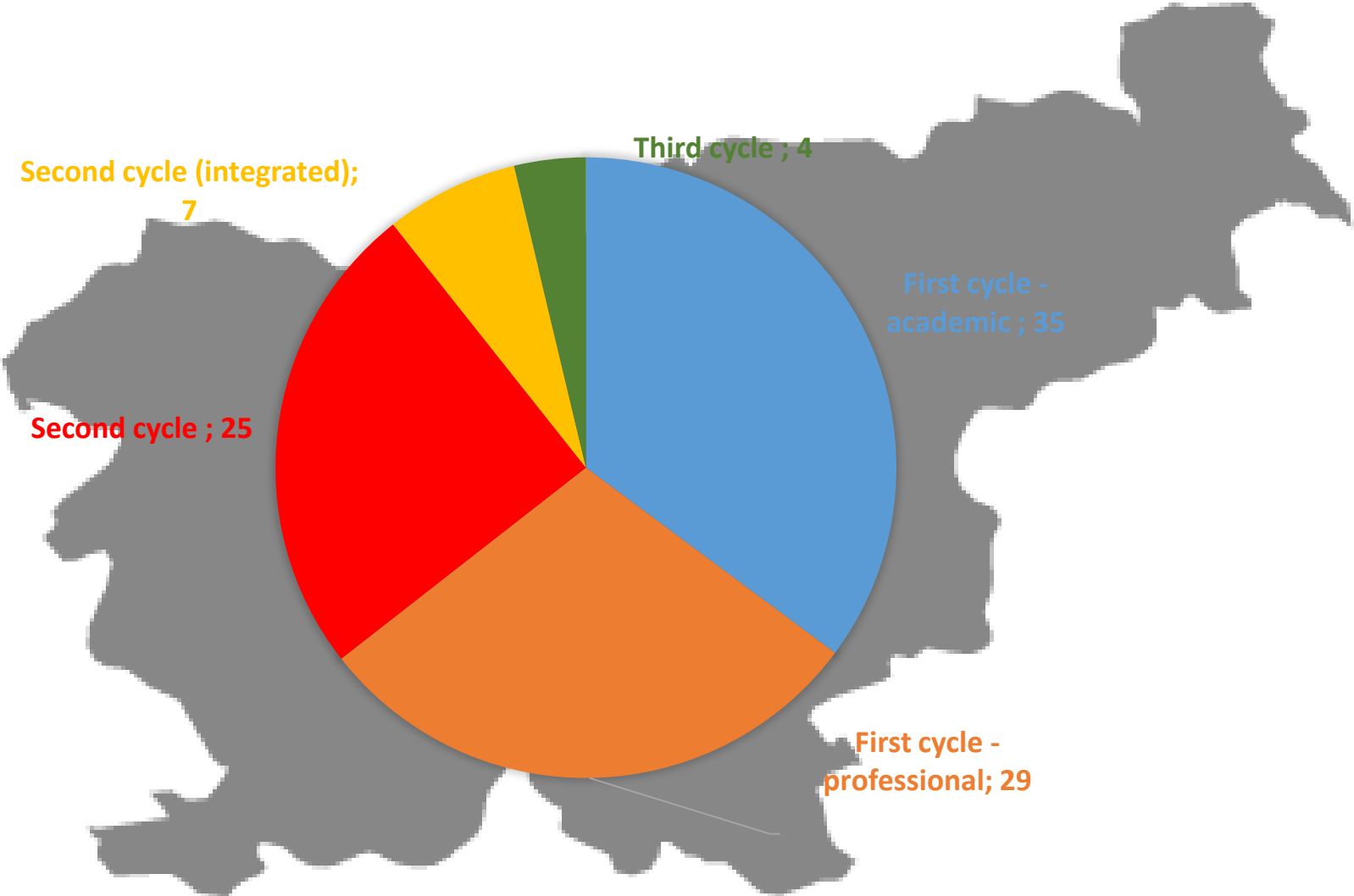

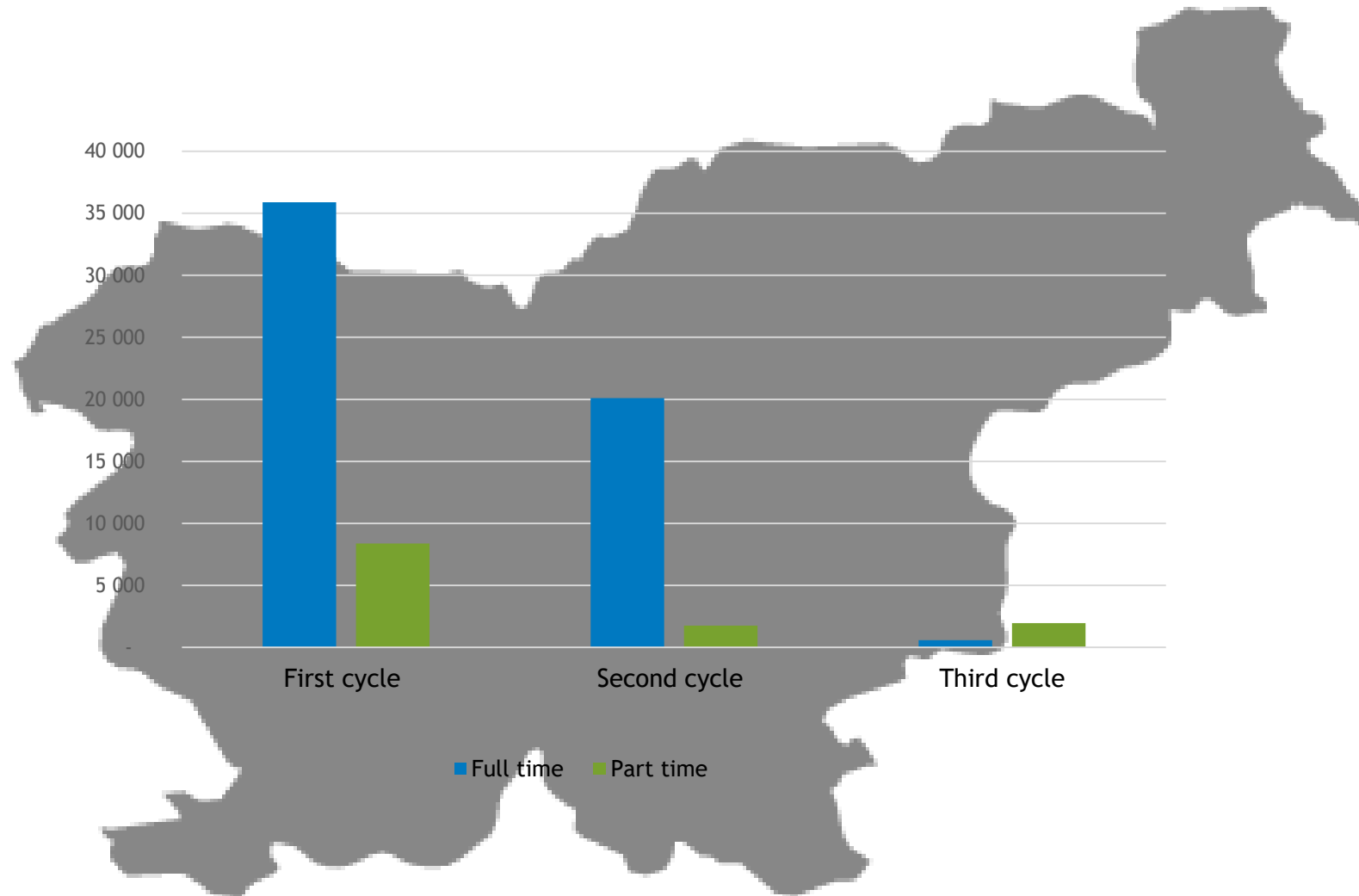

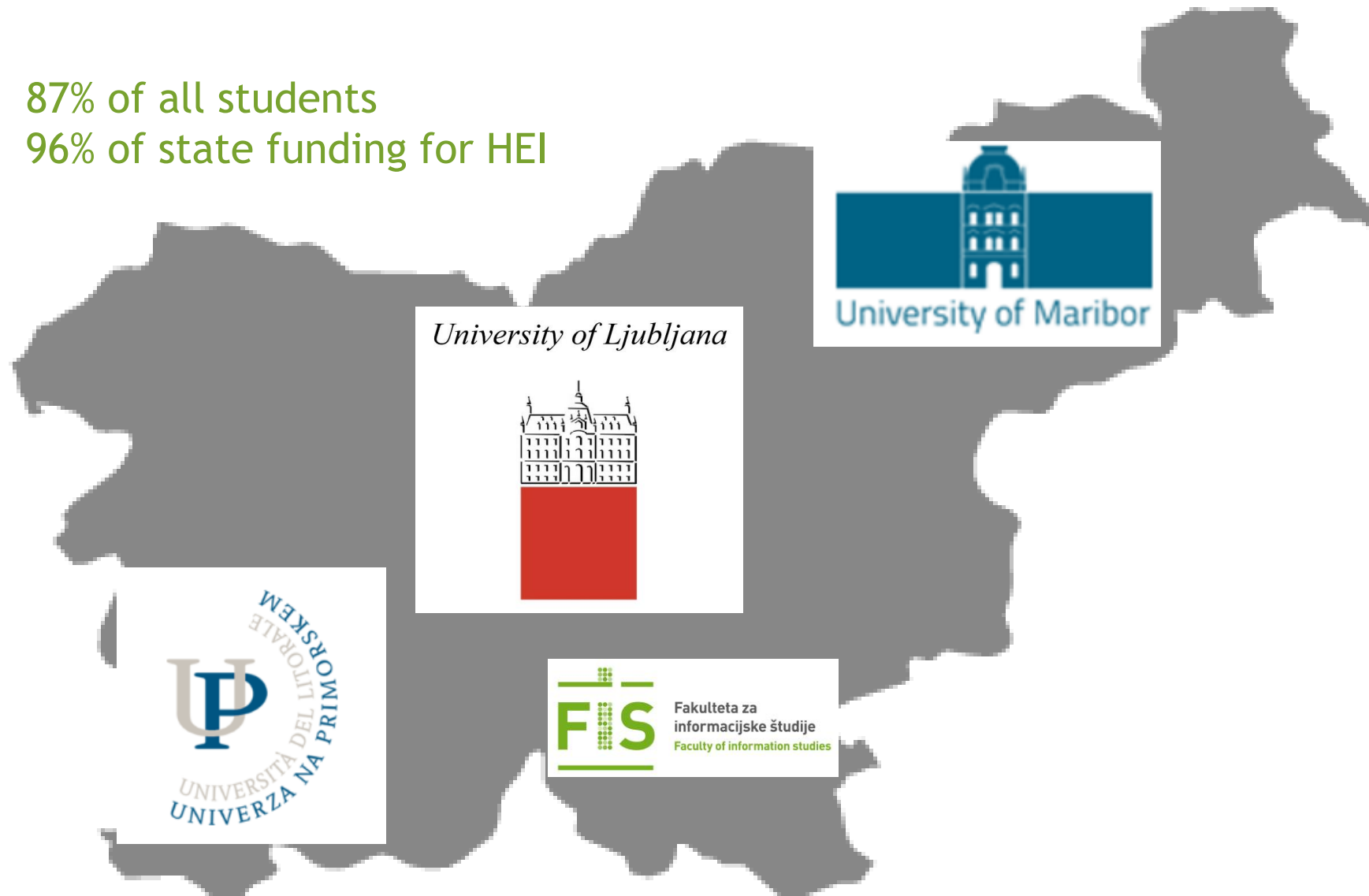

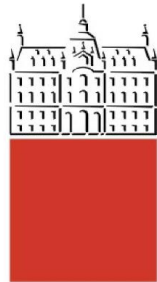

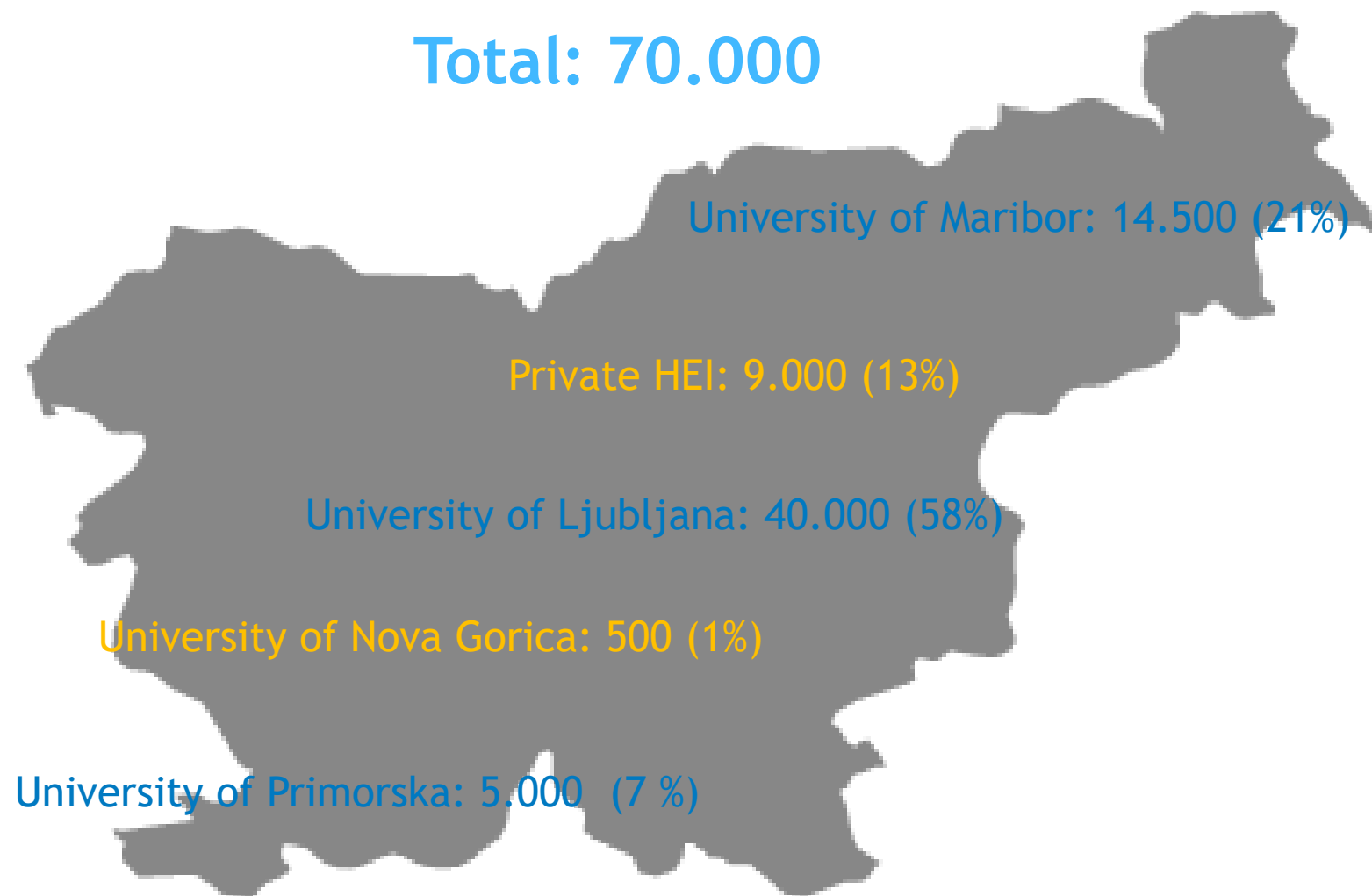

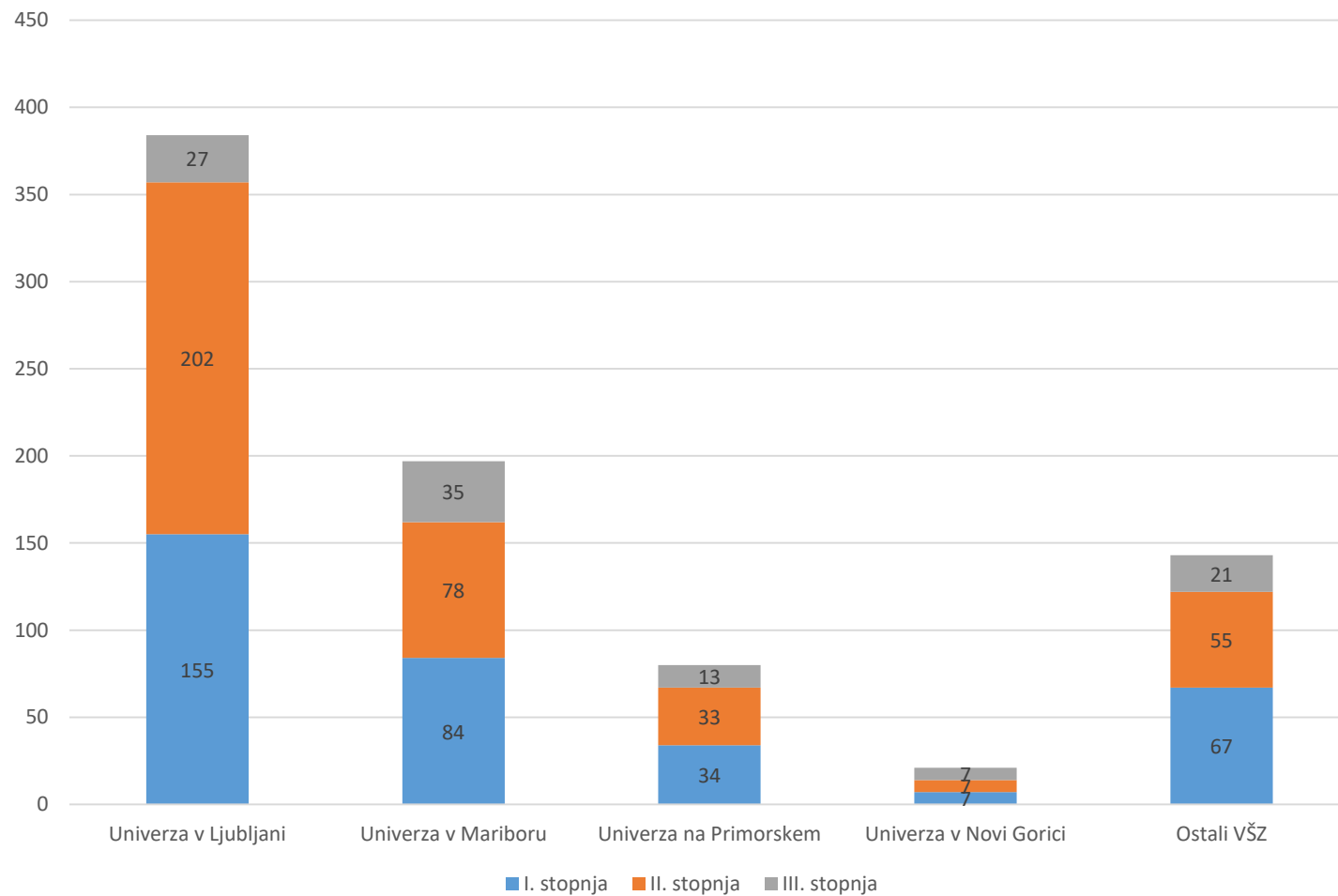


Number of HE students by HEI, 2016/17

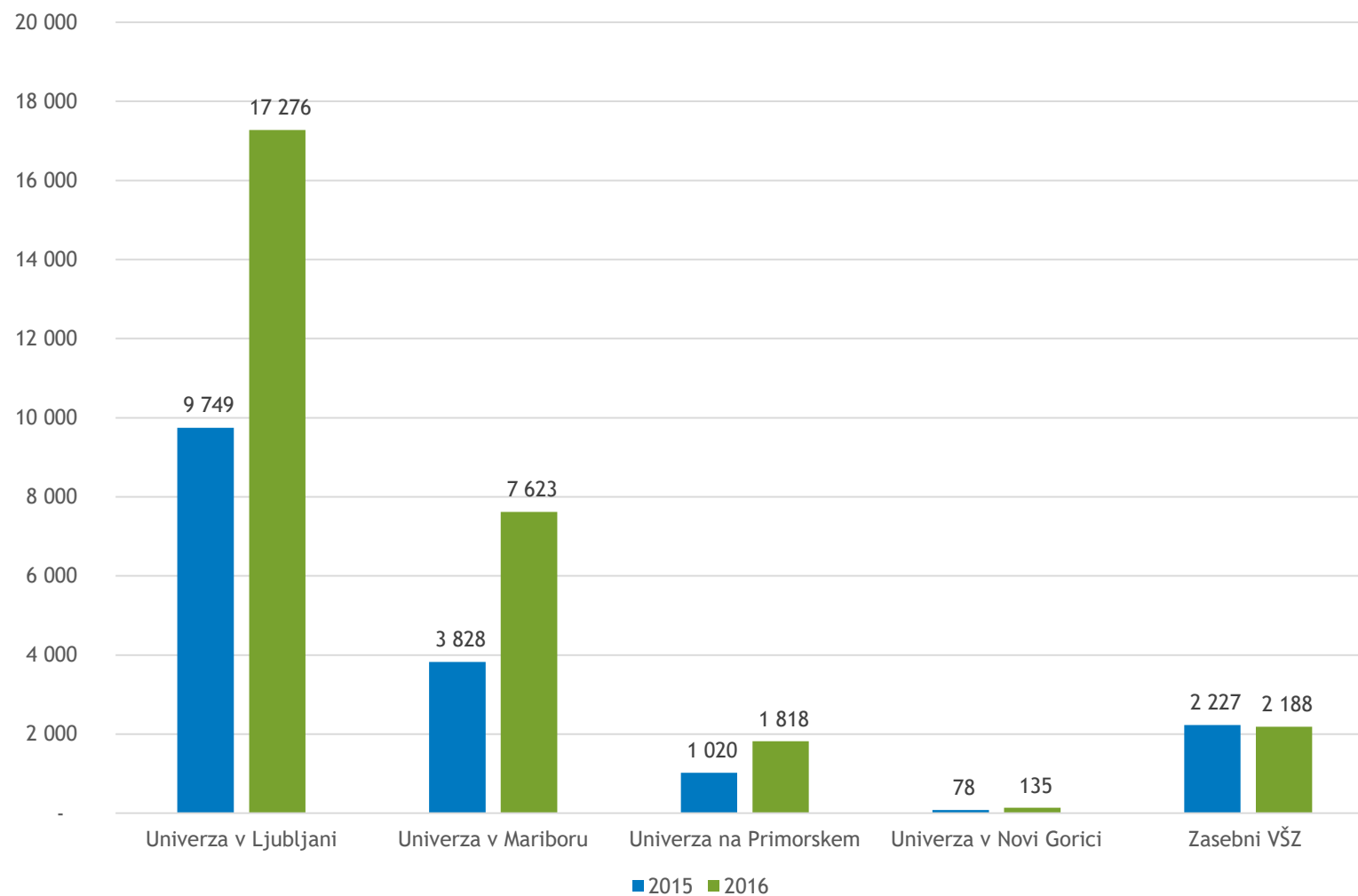

Number of graduates by HEI, 2015-16

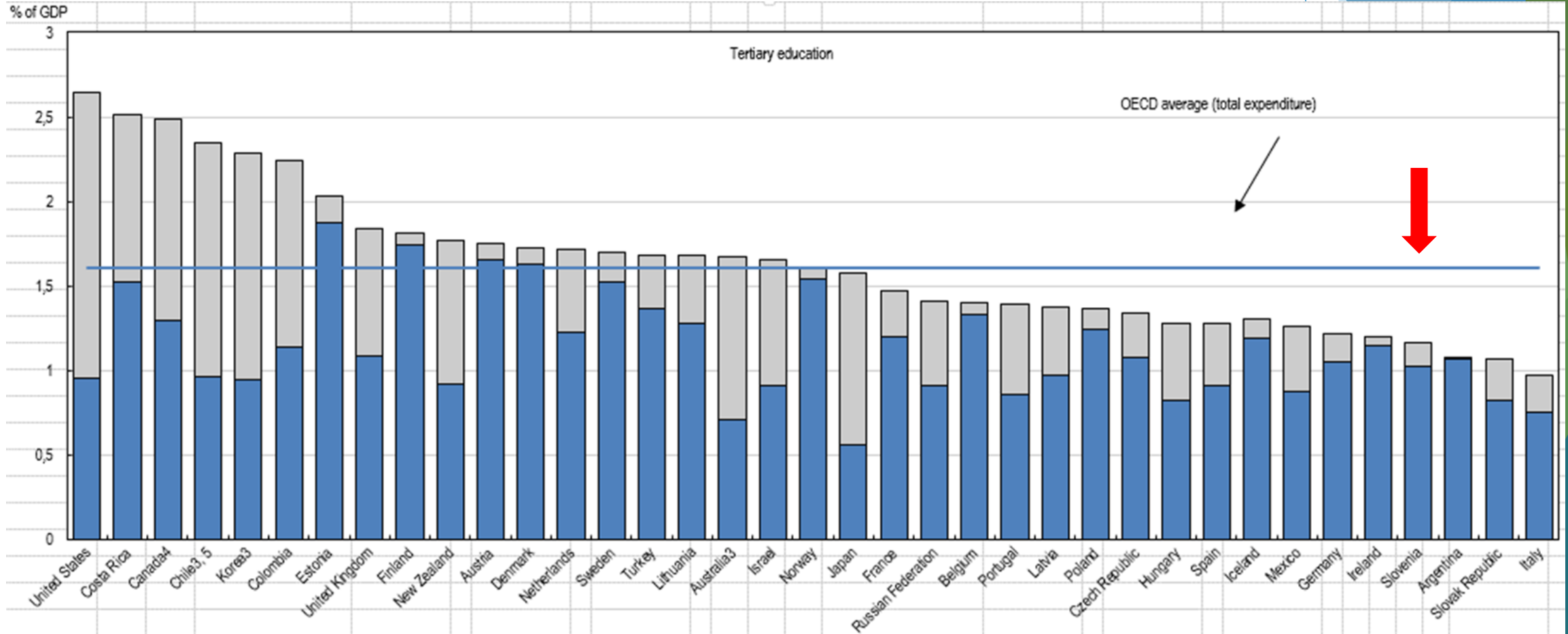

Public and private expenditure on tertiary education institutions as a percentage of GDP (2013)

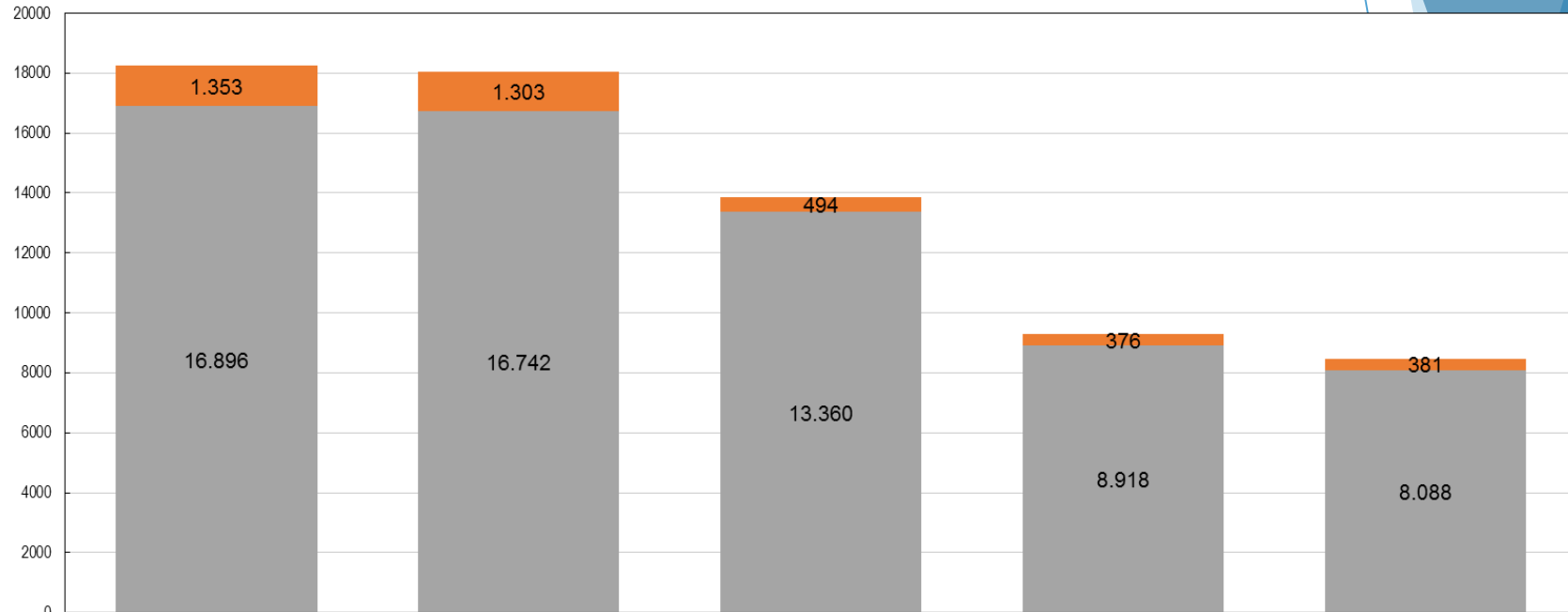

Annual expenditure per student by tertiary educational institutions for all services (2013)



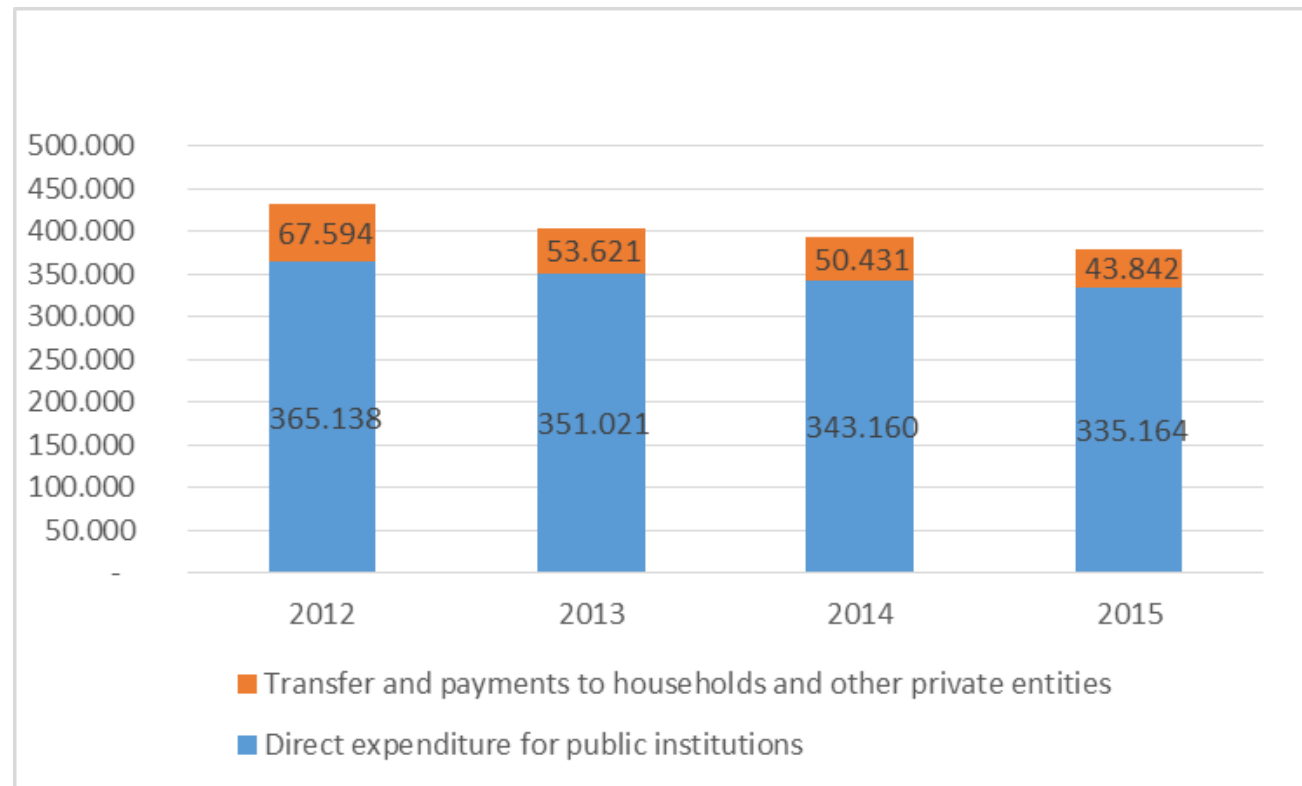

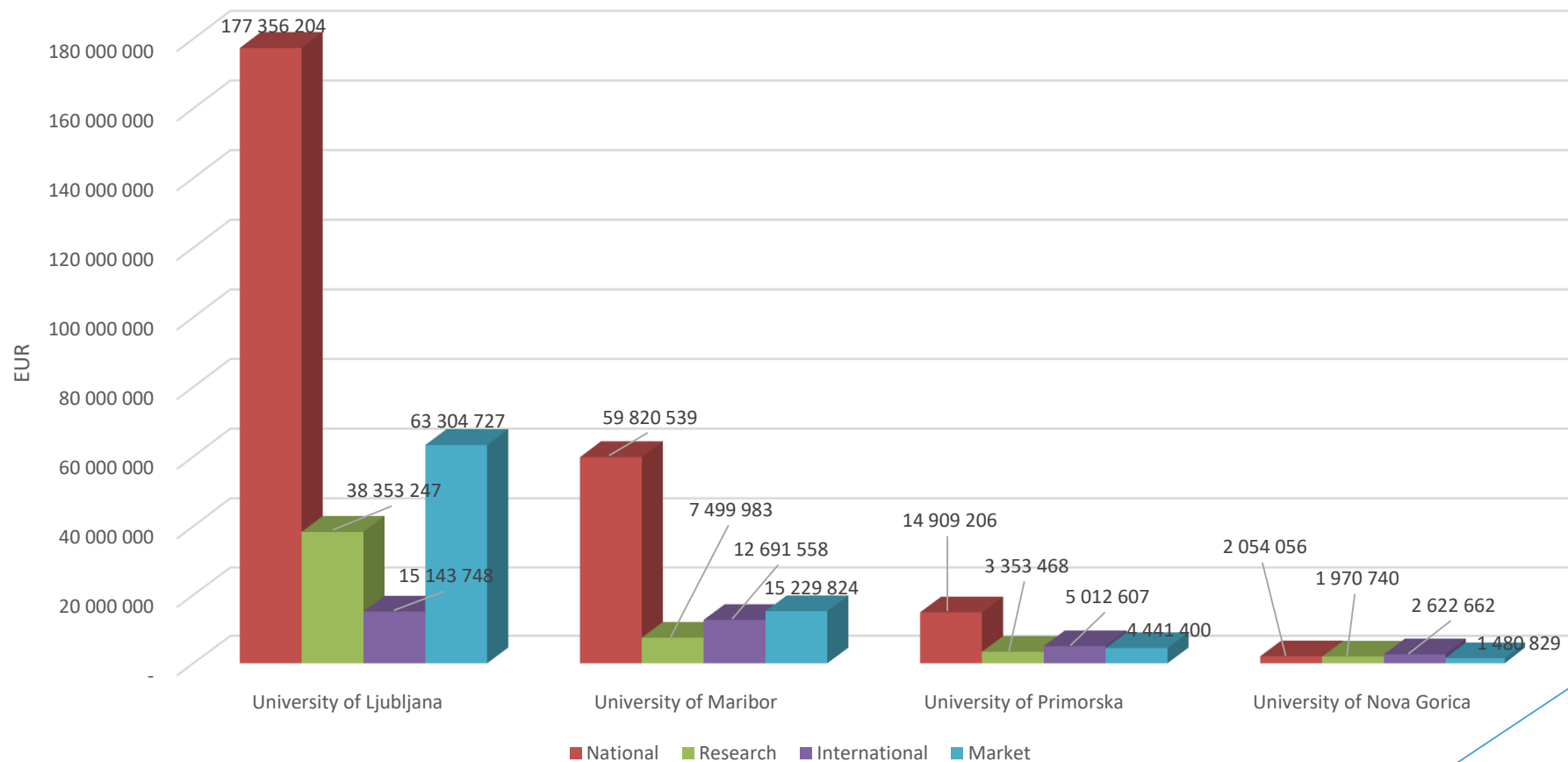

Public expenditure for formal tertiary education by purpose of expenditure, 2012-15 (1.00 EUR)

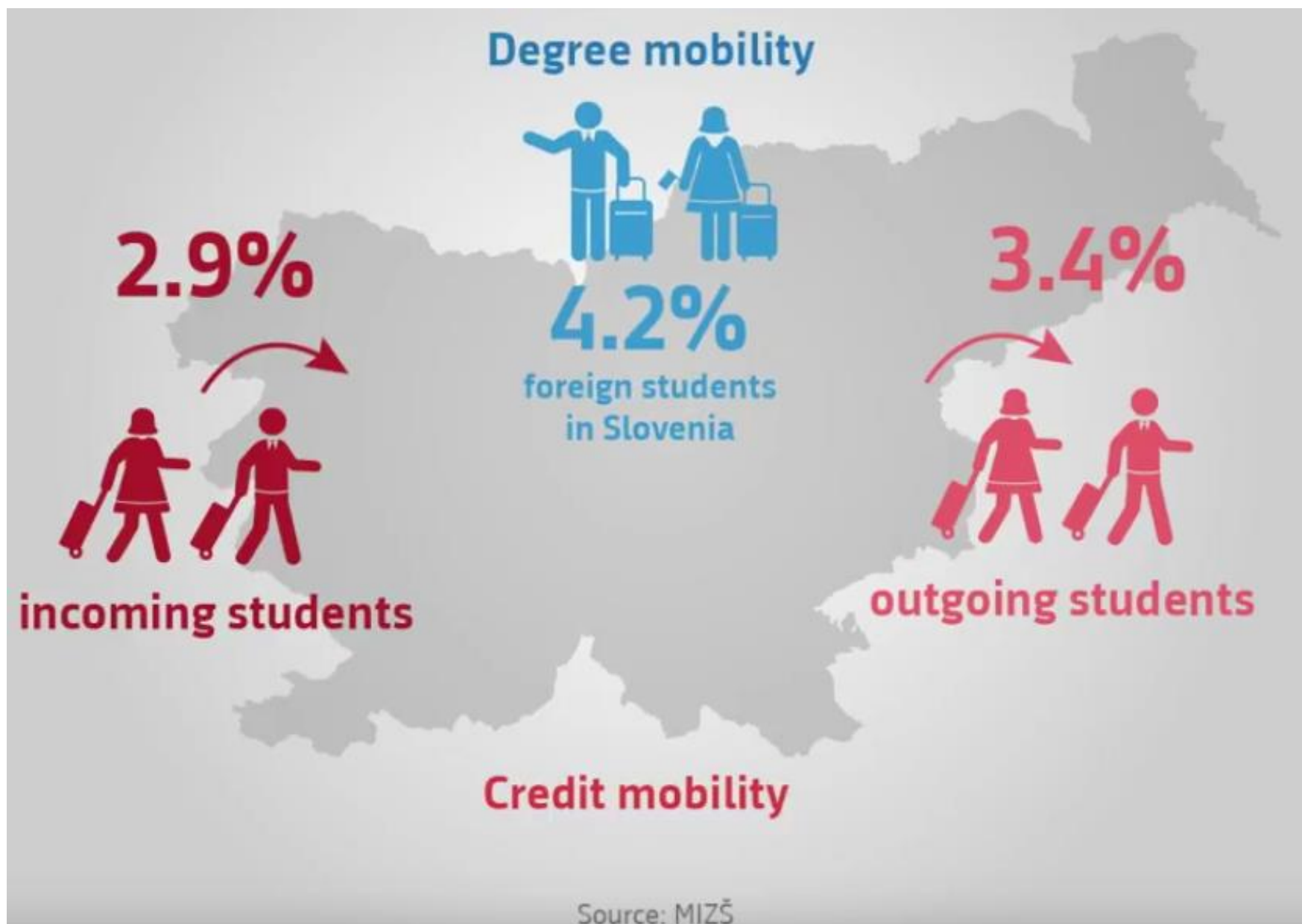

Sources of funding of universities, 2015



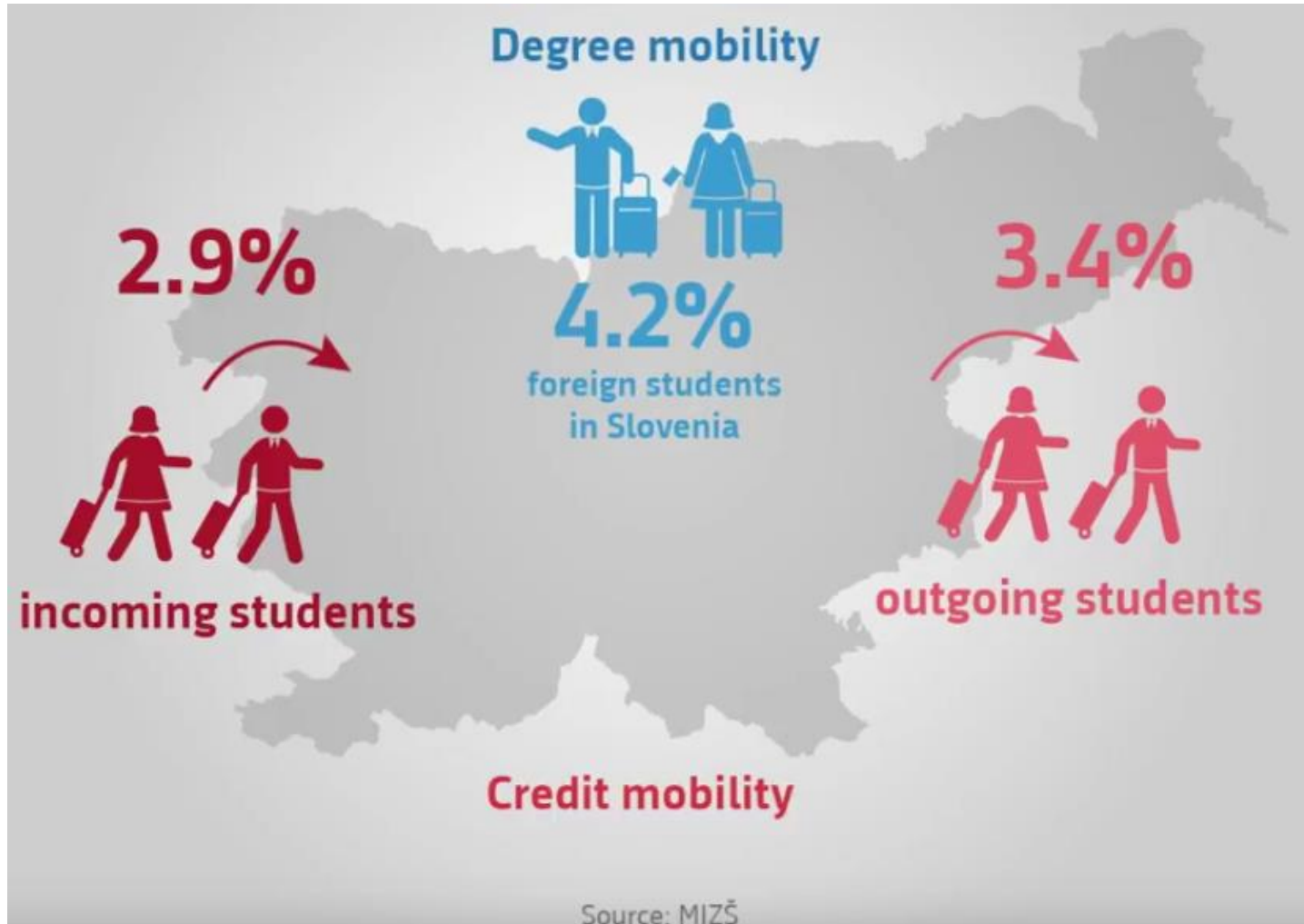

CHALLENGES FACING HIGHER EDUCATION IN SLOVENIA

1. Increasing the number of Slovenian students on student exchanges and student internships abroad



Measures:

- Implementation of programmes Erasmus+, CEEPUS, bilaterals
- Additional funding for Erasmus + grants (for all students)
- Ad futura scholarships for study visits and participation in competitions abroad
- The inclusion of students from disadvantaged backgrounds in mobility programmes (additional funding for mobile students from disadvantaged backgrounds in Erasmus+)

Objective 2020: 20% mobile graduates

2. Increasing the number of full-time study programmes in Slovenia

Measures:

- Increasing the number of English-taught study programmes
- Promoting Slovenia as a study destination
- Promoting the development of strategic partnerships

3. Increasing the number of visiting international experts and higher education teachers in Slovenian higher education institutions

Measures:

- Establishing a support centre to help international professionals, teachers and researchers with administrative processes
- Removing regulatory barriers to encouraging mobility of staff from non-EU countries
- Informing international higher education teachers on Slovenian culture, society and language

4. Promoting the development of intercultural competences

Measures:

- Including intercultural competences and internationalized learning outcomes in study programmes
- Removing administrative barriers to the accreditation of international joint and double/multiple degree study programmes
